Collaboration between three of New Zealand's heritage institutions (Te Papa Museum, Alexander Turnbull Library and Archives New Zealand) to produce this research and publication, will enable conservators to better evaluate the deterioration of the Waitangi sheet, open the doors to further research and develop conservation strategies for its ongoing care.
